Will Camp Nemo Change the International SCENES Focus?



Kandersteg International Scout Centre in Switzerland hosted the second SCENES seminar May 18 to 23, 2010. Dr. Hague "Doc" Vaughan, an ecologist and retired Director of Environment Canada's Ecological Monitoring and Assessment Network, EMAN, was there representing both Scouts Canada and Camp Nemo. These seminars are run for the purpose of getting representatives of National Scouting Organizations, SCENES Centres and potential SCENES Centres together to exchange ideas.

Five SCENES Centres did promotional presentations and Doc presented a keynote on behalf of the Canadian Scenes Committee and Camp Nemo. He reported that "The Nemo example, of offering programming, was exceedingly well received and viewed as a needed addition to the present SCENES Center focus which emphasizes environmentally conscious building and property maintenance. The result is key learning for leaders and administrators but it does little in the way of environmental skills and ethics for youth." Our focus at Camp Nemo, to give youth a fun place to learn and develop good environmental ethics, was highly praised. He went on to say that "Our approach was so well received that I now find myself on the 4 member steering committee of the International SCENES Network. The Camp Nemo-Blue Springs combination is seen as an example for the global program we all should be proud."



Youth need to have fun at camp. They need to play in the creek, get muddy, build shelters, find walking sticks and build campfires. We just need to teach them to do it in a responsible way. Youth love the camp and the education they receive will

help protect it for generations to come. Ethics developed in camp will guide them for the rest of their lives. Managing Camp Nemo in an environmentally responsible way will help protect 158 acres of land but teaching stewardship skills to youth will have a much larger impact.

I would like to point out that SCENES will not drastically affect Camp Nemo but it may impact other camps around the world. A Camp Nemo Stewardship committee was formed back in 1994 and it has been working to protect the camp environment and to engage both youth and leaders ever since. The HICOP and its programs are not a result of SCENES because many members were working on these projects long before the SCENES movement was started. The SCENES accreditation is, however, international validation of all this work. We should indeed be very proud of our camp.

In closing, I would like to congratulate Elizabeth Barrow on her very well deserved promotion. You have been Camp Nemo's champion and you will be greatly missed. Please don't be a stranger.
